Volume of cut through and speeding traffic has increased substantially with opening of Capital City Charter School, one block over on Peabody St. Parked cars have been hit multiple times with cars trying to squeeze by. Residents forced to sit and wait to exit their cars and forced to yell and signal to cars to slow down!
